Morning division: 09:30 am. Afternoon division: 1:45 pm Boating times as per the draw

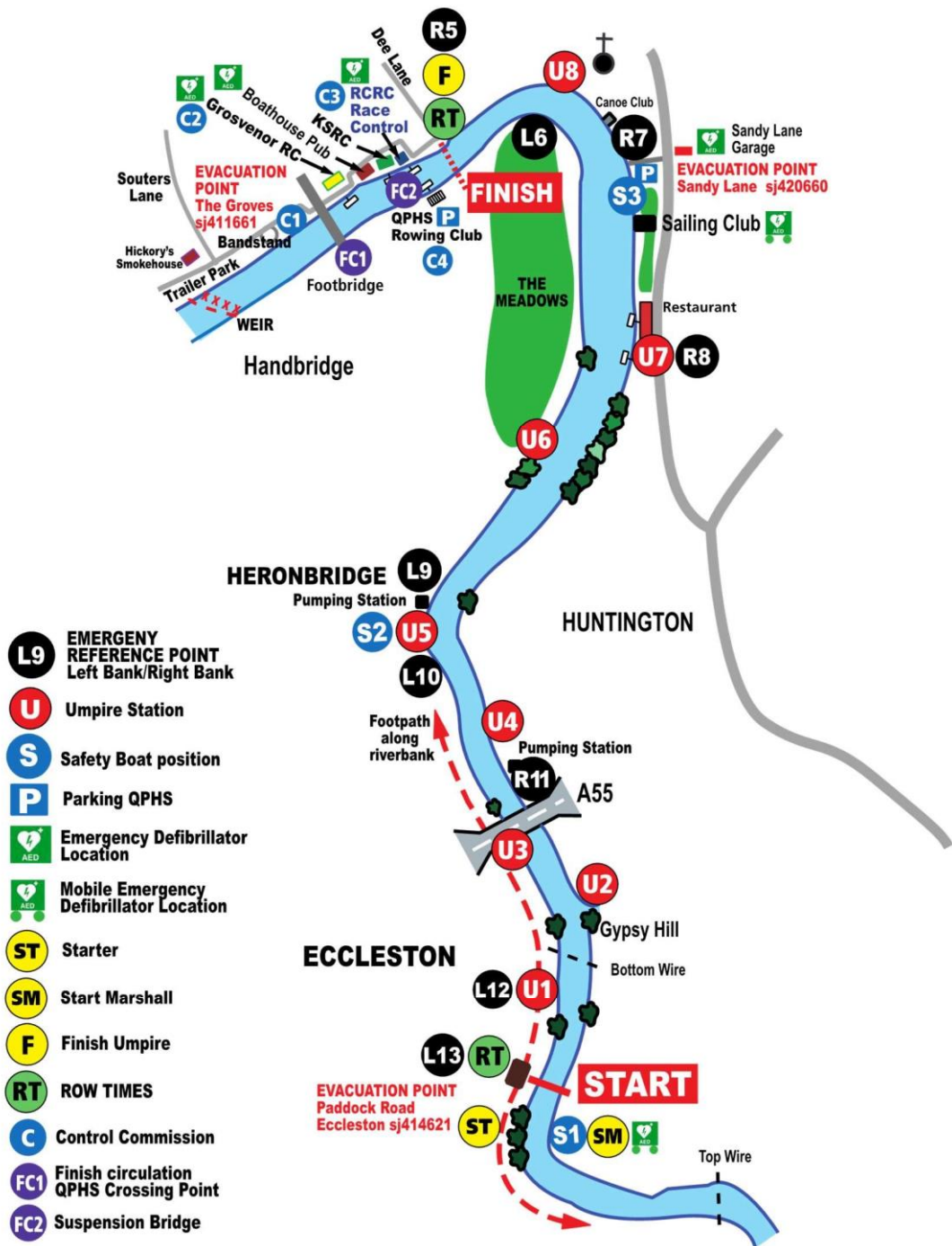
1.3 Safety, conduct and Local Rules

Safety is the responsibility of each competitor and club. All competitors and boats must conform with British Rowing's RowSafe guidance and rules of racing.

- Backstays are mandatory on the forward most riggers port and starboard on all craft other than singles. You will not be permitted to boat without them.
- All craft without sealed buoyancy compartments must have inflated buoyancy aids fitted. You will not be permitted to boat without them.
- Dry Robes and Hoodies are not permitted to be worn on the water (See Rowsafe)
- Long hair must be tied up so as not to obscure competitor numbers and/or cause a drowning hazard in the event of a capsize. Recommend tied up in a Bun.
- Competitors are not permitted to practise outside the published boating times as safety boat cover will not be in place.
- Due to safety restrictions associated with the tide and boat when instructed. Late attendance to the landing stage may result in you being prevented from racing.
- We have a zero tolerance policy for unsporting behaviour from any member, coach or supporter of visiting clubs. We hope that we do not need to enforce this but in the event of an incident we shall follow guidance in the current British Rowing Rules of Racing.

1.5 Alternative Finish Line

During high flow rates on the river, The Race Committee may shorten the course to finish at Sandy Lane (Position R7) as per the Alternative Arrangements Plan.

2.0 Registration

Registration for all competitors is in the main Royal Chester Rowing Club's clubhouse. What3words location: plan.zips.glory, One representative from each club should register with the entries secretary, confirm any substitutions with evidence of the associated British Rowing membership and collect their folder of race numbers.

2.1 Competitors' briefing

- The competitor notes are intended to replace an in person briefing.
- Club representatives will be informed of any late updates on conditions or changes when they attend registration.

2.2 Prize Giving

Due to the very tight time between divisions, there will only be one prize giving at the end of Division 2 racing. Prize Giving will be at Royal Chester Rowing Club's Clubhouse or Pontoon. Winners who cannot stay for the prize giving may collect medals from Registration.

3.0 Safety & Welfare

St John's Ambulance will be stationed at the Royal Chester Rowing Club's Clubhouse and will provide cover for The Groves and Queen's Park areas.

Please read our safety and welfare documents on our website which contain key contact details.

- Competitors should be suitably dressed including for the row to the start, a wait of up to 120 minutes at the start and racing. When considering what to wear please take into account conditions including sun, wind, rain, temperature, combined chill factor to hypothermia. Competitors deemed unsuitably dressed will not be allowed to boat and / or race.
- Dry Robes and Hoodies are not permitted on the water.
- Long hair must be tied up so as not to obscure competitor numbers and/or cause a drowning hazard in the event of a capsize. Recommend tied up in a Bun.
- Competitors are not permitted to practise outside the published boating times as safety boat cover will not be in place.
- The river is not closed to other users. Commercial pleasure craft (tourist boats) will be operating and other rivers users e.g. paddle boarders, canoeists may also be afloat.

4.0 On the Water and Boating

The draw will include details of crews' allocated boating location and times to boat. Competitors must boat at their allocated times. Anyone attempting to boat late may be refused permission to proceed to the start.

Competitors are not permitted to practise outside the published boating times as safety boat cover will not be in place.

4.1 Proceeding to the start

Competitors should proceed to the start on the Meadows side of the river i.e. should keep to the sculler's left / cox's right. Boats may overtake on the way up to the start, using the centre of the river. The river will not be closed to other craft. Competitors must keep a good lookout and take action to avoid collisions.

4.2 Boating Check Points

There are two cut off points when proceeding to the start:

- The cut off to the Red House, about 3.5 km from the start, is 45 minutes before division start time.
- The cut off to the Road Bridge, about 1.2 km from the start, is 25 minutes before start time.

Crews who do not reach the cut off points in time may be turned back to ensure a division is not delayed.

4.3 Marshalling

Competitors will marshal above the start at Eccleston Ferry. Marshals will be stationed on the water and on the river banks, competitors must at all times obey the Marshals instructions.

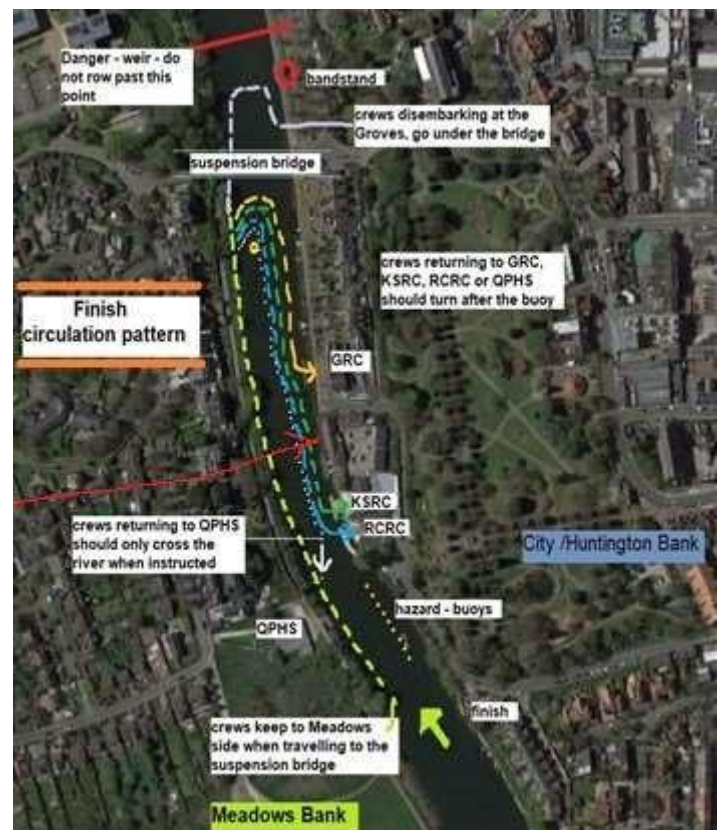
4.4 Finish Circulation Pattern

The finish circulation pattern to be followed by all competitors is given below.

After the finish, boats must continue on The Meadows (cox's left / scullers right) side of the river towards the suspension bridge. Marshals in launches will instruct crews.

There is a large weir just beyond the suspension bridge. The weir is clearly marked by large yellow warning signs. Crews are advised not to paddle past the bandstand towards the weir.

5.0 Parking



Please note your assigned boating location is detailed within the published draw. Please do not change to a different boating location without first obtaining agreement from the event organisers.

5.1 For trailers carrying boats to the Groves and Bandstand boating locations:

Use the A51 or A41 roads from the East M53 / A55 outer ring road.

Bandstand

- Turn onto Dee Lane
- Follow the road until you reach the suspension bridge
- Follow marshal instructions

The Groves (Hickories End)

Follow the Souters Lane route. **WARNING** some sat navs confuse Souters Lane with the entrance to the Old Bishops Palace: check exactly where you are being directed to.

- Follow marshals' instructions at roundabout
- Trailers should be reversed into the Hickory's end and Bandstand end of the Groves, following the instructions of the parking marshals. Towing vehicles may remain at the Groves, but must move their vehicles to the City side of the road.
- Please follow instructions from the marshals when parking vehicles and assembling / moving boats.

5.2 For trailers and cars carrying boats to (QPRC)

Follow the A483 Wrexham Road, Overleigh Road then Queens' Park Road. **You should NOT** cut through the city due to ongoing road works and road closures. Trailer parking is provided onsite at QPRC.

5.3 Parking at RCRC

Parking adjacent to Royal Chester Rowing Club's clubhouse is reserved for safety support, umpires and other race officials only. On race day there is no car parking at Royal Chester Rowing Club or on The Groves for competitors, spectators or club members.

5.4 Parking For competitors, spectators, and Royal Chester members

The two main car parks recommended, both within a short walking distance, are:

- Queens Park High School Queen's Park View, Handbridge, Chester, CH4 7AE £4 per car pay on the day
- Little Roodee Car Park Grosvenor Rd, Chester CH1 1SL is also paid for parking £6 up to 12 hours
